

Senior Noah Applegate became Penn's All-Time Boys Basketball Career Scoring Leader, breaking a 55-year old standard, and the Kingsmen overpowered Goshen, 80-57, in high school action on Saturday, Jan. 26, 2019.

Applegate scored 20 points in the victory. The 6-foot-6 Hillsdale commit surpassed the previous mark of 1433 points set by Keith Berkey (1960-1964) with a basket in the second quarter. Applegate entered the game with 1,425 career points. Applegate now has 1,445 points. He also had four rebounds, three assists and three steals.

Drew Lutz led Penn with 24 points, eight assists and five steals.

Beau Ludwick turned in an exceptional effort for the Kingsmen with 11 points, seven rebounds, five assists and seven steals.

Kegan Hoskins scored 10 points and battled for seven rebounds.

The Tigers advanced 8 of 12 wrestlers to next weekend's Penn Regional on their way to a third place finish.

Warsaw put 4 wrestlers in the finals and had Jose Grimmert bring home the championship at 152 pounds. Grimmert battled his way to the top spot with a pair of tight matches and a 3-0 record for the day.

Warsaw's other finalists and second place finishers were Jose Martinez at 113, Jacob Bass at 145, and Brandon Estepp at 160.

Martinez was a winner by tech-fall in the semis to advance to the finals.

Bass picked up a first-period pin in his first match, then won by major decision in the semis.

Estepp also was a winner by pin in the first round, then knocked off the top seed in the semis.

Andrew Ross finished in third place at 120 pounds.

Ross went 3-1 on the day with two tough wins by decision in the opening and placement matches, with a pin in the conso-semis.

Isaiah Owens at 126, Brock Hogenson at 132, and Brock Hueber at 195 rounded out the qualifiers for Warsaw with fourth place finishes.

Owens battled back from a first-round loss to make it through. His path to placement included a forfeit and a major decision in the consolation semis.

Hogenson followed a similar path to fourth with wins by forfeit and major decision in the consolations.

Hueber started the day with win by pin before losing in the semifinals. He then won by pin in the conso semis to advance through.

Each of the the Tigers' remaining wrestlers: Austin Brown at 138, Jayton Brock at 170, Angel Mendez at 182, and Griffin Reed at 285; brought home fifth place and won their last matches by pin to pick up valuable team points.

Penn Senior Beau Ludwick ignited a torrid Kingsmen attack in the first half and helped Penn sprint past Mishawaka, 75-61, in high school basketball action on Friday, Jan. 25, 2019.

Penn led 15-13 after one quarter when Ludwick took command. He sparked a 27-8 second-quarter run and finished the first half with 14 points on 6-of-8 shooting and led Penn to a 42-21 halftime lead.

Ludwick finished with 19 points.

Drew Lutz scored 22 points and dished out five assists for the Kingsmen.

Noah Applegate scored 16 points, including two thunderous monster jams.

Applegate is now nine points shy of become Penn's all-time leading scorer in the Kingsmen Boys Basketball Program. Applegate has 1,425 points. The record was set 55 years ago and is owned by Keith Berkey, who scored 1,433 points from 1960-1964.
